

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

For

ADMISSIONS EARLY ASSURANCE PROGRAM

Between

NEW YORK INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY COLLEGE OF OSTEOPATHIC MEDICINE

And

QUEENS COLLEGE OF THE CITY UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK

SUMMARY

The following agreement pertains to the “4+4 program” in which undergraduate students in a bachelor’s degree-granting program of Queens College, CUNY, who intend to pursue Osteopathic Medicine and meet the requirements set forth below, will be assured of a seat in New York Institute of Technology’s College of Osteopathic medicine after completion of the Bachelor of Arts degree.

I. PURPOSE

This document is an articulation agreement between the New York Institute of Technology (NYIT) College of Osteopathic Medicine and Queens College, CUNY, in connection with an Osteopathic Medicine Admissions Early Assurance Program. The Admissions Early Assurance Program is an admissions program for exceptional candidates with outstanding college records and correspondingly high MCAT scores to distinguish themselves to the NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine.

II. ADMISSIONS

To be eligible for this early action program the applicant must have completed the first two years (60 credits) of undergraduate education at Queens College, CUNY, and meet the following criteria:

- Overall and science grade point averages of 3.2

- Favorable evaluations by two professorial faculty members from the Division of Mathematics and the Natural Sciences, and an additional one from a professorial faculty member of another Division at Queens College.

In addition, to continue enrollment in the program and be accepted to NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine, the student must meet the following criteria:

- Maintain the overall and science grade point average of 3.2
- An MCAT score of at least 27, with a minimum grade of 8 in each section
- Completion of a minimum of 8 hours of biology (course/lab), 10 hours each of inorganic and organic chemistry (course/lab), 8 hours of physics (course/lab), one semester college math, and 6 hours of college English, with no grade below B in any of these courses or labs.
- Completing favorably a personal interview by NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine faculty

Eligibility is not a guarantee that the candidate will be granted admission to NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine; candidates will be held to the same rigorous admissions standards as other applicants which include consideration for additional courses such as cell biology, biochemistry, and/or microbiology, and final decisions will be solely at the discretion of NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine. Students enrolled in this program who do not meet or exceed the above standards have the privilege of applying for admission to NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine through the regular channels or procedures. All candidates must meet NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine admission standards at the time of their enrollment into NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine. NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine reserves the right to deny admission to students who, in the opinion of NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine, may have difficulty obtaining a medical license.

Early Assurance Deadlines

Application deadline – May 1 following the student's sophomore year

Completion of the applicant's file – June 1 following the student's junior year.

After completion of the application and following the student's sophomore year (60 credits of undergraduate work), an applicant who has earned an overall and science GPA of at least 3.2 and who has received favorable faculty evaluations (*vide supra*) and is recommended by the Premedical Committee will be encouraged to participate in a series of enrichment programs that will be held during the summer between the sophomore and junior years, and periodically during the junior year.

III. CANCELLATION

Either party to this agreement may cancel by written notification to the person representing the other party identified below, which notification must be received by October 1st in the year preceding the date of cancellation. All students who are

enrolled in the program at the time of such notification shall be continued in the program and shall be eligible for acceptance by NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine under the terms of the agreement.

IV. MISCELLANEOUS

It is understood that this Agreement is not intended to and shall not be construed to create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture or association between Queens College, CUNY and NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine, but is rather an Agreement by and between independent contractors.
